WARM HANDS ART THERAPY We were pleased to partner with the Ukrainian Cultural and Humanitarian Institute (UCHI) to host an appearance

by the renowned Ukrainian artist, art therapist, humanitarian and nation-rebuilder Tetiana Mialkovska on campus in October (photo). Tetiana is the founder and director of the nonprofit organization Pyaternya, whose mission is to provide much-needed art therapy in war -torn Ukraine. Pyaternya's Warm Hands program offers interventional trauma therapy for orphaned and displaced children, widows and soldiers whose lives have been torn apart by the war. Ukraine is on the cutting edge of art therapy on a massive scale, this demon-



stration illustrated how the arts can facilitate healing and are pivotal in the resistance against the attempted annihilation of Ukrainian culture. After learning about the roots of the program and the incredible work done by Pyaternya, guests participated in a Master Class with Tetiana. Utilizing her art therapy curriculum, participants created their own emotional masterpieces.



Western Palm Sunday!




As a result of our successful events, we have been able to make donations or contribute funds to various local charities, ASC, our camping programs and toward the need of new roofs for our parish buildings.














#### **Greetings from Philly!**


